Lightsview Community Commitment

Express trip home

After years of campaigning, Labor has committed to establishing a Lightsview to City Go Zone.

Lightsview was marketed as a cosmopolitan suburb close to the CBD with access to public transport, which would limit the need for car ownership.

Sadly, neither Lightsview or Northgate have been provided with access to public transport as promised in the marketing materials.

Local resident Lynelle said, "I'm a student who takes the bus to and from school every day. If I miss the morning 206 bus, I have to walk all the way to Hampstead Road. The 202 and 208 buses just aren't viable for me."

Since being elected, your local Member of Parliament Andrea Michaels has been fighting to have additional public transport services provided for the residents of Lightsview and Northgate.

Andrea sought the community's feedback through two public transport surveys in 2019 and 2020, which resulted in securing a Go Zone in the Marshall Government's overhaul of bus routes across metropolitan Adelaide, which was later scrapped.

In December 2021, Andrea started a petition Demand Better Bus Services calling on the Government to improve public transport options in Lightsview and Northgate. The petition was signed by more than 700 people.

Following the success of the petition, Labor has committed to improving services for residents of Lightsview and Northgate.

The Lightsview to City Go Zone route will run from the City to Lightsview via O-Bahn, Klemzig and East Parkway. Go Zone services will operate approximately every 15 minutes between 6.30am and 6.30pm Monday to Friday (every 10 minutes or more in peak times) and every 30 minutes at night, Saturday, Sunday, and public holidays until 10pm.

Female facilities grant

Local sporting communities in the Enfield electorate will benefit from an elected Labor Government with a promise of \$750,000 for the construction of female changes rooms at both Duncan Fraser Reserve and Blair Athol Reserve.

The upgrade to Duncan Fraser Reserve will be a much-needed boost for the Gepps Cross Football Club and Gepps Cross Cricket Club. These two clubs have seen a huge jump in participation from women looking to be involved in football and cricket in recent years. This growth has brought success with the Gepps Cross Rams women's team winning the Women's Division 5 Premiership in 2021.

The upgrade to Blair Athol Reserve will benefit the Kilburn Football Club, Kilburn Cricket Club, and the Ghan Kilburn City Football Club. The Ghan Kilburn City Football Club started out in 2002 with just 22 players, it now boasts over 150 members including senior, youth and women's teams.

Intesection Upgrade Plan

Main North Road / Regency Road

An elected Labor Government has a plan to improve the Main North Road and Regency Road intersection. With more than 70,000 vehicles using this intersection each day, this is long overdue.

R.M. Williams Reserve Upgrade

A better park for a growing community

Andrea has secured \$125,000 in funding to upgrade R.M. Williams Reserve in Walkley Heights.

Due to electoral boundary changes, Walkley Heights will be joining the Enfield electorate at the 19 March 2022 state election. As such, Andrea has been in the community regularly holding street corner meetings with local residents.

Many people raised concern about the poor condition of the playground equipment at RM Williams Drive Reserve. The playground was constructed early in the development of Walkley's Heights making it over 20 years old.

Andrea wrote to the City of Salisbury advocating for the equipment to be urgently upgraded. However, the Council advised that the reserve was not due for an upgrade for another 3 to 5 years' time.

Labor's Service SA Commitment

Supercharging Service SA

A Malinauskas Labor government will supercharge Service SA branches, including opening major branches on Saturdays for the first time.

Labor's Serving South Australia plan includes three key measures:

- Longer Hours: Labor will open major metropolitan Service SA branches on Saturdays from 9am - 5pm
- New Services: Labor will expand the services available to make Service SA a one-stop shop for all government services.
- New Website: Labor will deliver an easy to navigate government-wide, one-stop shop online platform.

Labor's plan would see the Marion, Seaford Meadows, Elizabeth, and most importantly Prospect and Modbury branches open on Saturdays, providing greater flexibility for South Australians who cannot get to a branch on a weekday.

New services offered through Service SA under Labor include:

- Registering births, relationships, and deaths
- A range of registration and licencing requirements for business and employment
- Applications for concessions, rebates and other assistance
- Applications for health and wellbeing support and services, child-care and disability support
- Housing services including public and social housing

Our plan stands in stark contrast to the Liberals record on Service SA, which included plans to close three branches including Prospect and Modbury before backtracking amid overwhelming community opposition.



An 18-month campaign fought by Andrea and many members of our community forced the Marshall Liberal government to back down on the closure of these branches.
