Expansion begins at Roma Mitchell Secondary College

Construction to expand the College began late last month. The investment of nearly \$21 million will establish a new 2-court gymnasium of international competition standard, change rooms, six classrooms, teacher prep areas, a first aid room, a canteen and a cafeteria.

The new facility will accommodate an additional 180 students increasing the overall school capacity to 2114 and providing a world-class indoor venue for students and the local community to utilise. It is scheduled for completion in early 2025.

\$100 Sports Voucher Program

The State Government's \$100 Sports Vouchers program has returned for 2024, now in its 10th year. The initiative launched by the former Labor Government has seen nearly 600,000 vouchers redeemed, providing more than \$48 million to help South Australian children participate in sport and active recreation.

Families with children participating in Scouts and Girl Guides are now able to participate in the program, with changes coming into effect on 1 January 2024.

The program is open to all school aged children up to Year 9, and in recent years has also been expanded to include learn to swim and dance. Those eligible can use one \$100 voucher per child in a calendar year.

SecondBite

I had the pleasure of visiting the team at SecondBite Dry Creek recently. They do an incredible job delivering food to many people in our community. SecondBite exists to ensure good food is getting to people who need it most, rather than going to landfill.

SecondBite is one of Australia's largest food rescue organisations who work with a range of food growers, manufacturers and retailers to rescue surplus and unsold edible food that would otherwise be wasted. After careful inspection they distribute the food to local charities (including several in Enfield) and not-forprofit organisations across Australia. The charity groups redistribute food to vulnerable Australians and provide nutritious meals for people to enjoy.

The community food program helps families in crisis, seniors, low-income households, refugees and asylum seekers, homeless people, Indigenous Australians and students.

HEALTH

The Malinauskas Labor Government is getting on with our election commitment to fix the ramping crisis and improve our health system. In the 2023-24 state budget, we committed an additional \$4.4 billion of operating funding for health.

We are working to deliver more than 550 new beds across the state's health system, with 150 of the beds due to open this year. Additionally, we have secured 350 additional ambos, are upgrading and expanding 14 ambulance stations and recruited an additional 550 full time clinical staff in just the first 12 months of Government.

Providing alternative treatment options for nonemergency medical care will reduce system pressures, which is why we are developing two hospital avoidance hubs in the northern and western suburbs to provide multidisciplinary care to patients modelled on similar successful services run in South Australia.

We are working to improve health system coordination for inter-hospital transfers and ensuring efficient responses to emerging blockages that exacerbate ramping.

The State Government also welcomes the Albanese Government's announcement of a new program providing rural medical student places through South Australia's Flinders University. This will see more medical students trained in SA.

COST OF LIVING RELIEF

Are you receiving all the State Government Concessions you are eligible for?

The State Government provides the following concessions and assistance:

- Cost of Living Concession
- Energy bill concession
- Emergency Services Levy (fixed property)
- Water and sewage rate concessions
- Companion Card

- Emergency Electricity Payment Scheme

Since partnering with the Commonwealth in July 2023, the Malinauskas Labor Government has begun delivering automatic quarterly rebates of up to \$125 to eligible electricity account holders as part of a \$254 million Energy Relief Plan. The rebate of up to \$500 on 2023-24 electricity bills is available to 420,000 eligible households with up to \$650 available for 86,000 eligible small businesses

The government also indexed concessions at a further cost of \$44 million over five years while seniors are benefitting from the government's decision to make public transport free at all times for Seniors Card holders.

HOUSING

The Malinauskas Labor Government is committed to increasing the supply of affordable housing across South Australia. We have fast tracked the State's biggest ever land-release for residential use and bought strategic parcels of land with the potential to deliver new housing or community uses now and into the future.

We have supported renters with major reforms, including banning rent bidding, and raising the bond threshold from \$250 to \$800 - so the majority of people will only pay a four week instead of six week bond. Reforms have also been made to allow tenants to have pets in rental homes with reasonable conditions, and to extend the

notice period to end a tenancy from 28 days to 60 days. We have expanded the Private Rental Assistance Program to help more people with bond and rent in advance and made reforms requiring a prescribed ground to terminate or not renew a tenancy.

We have made it easier to buy a home in SA by abolishing stamp duty for eligible first home buyers and establishing a 2% home loan through HomeStart.



Furthermore, we have committed \$17 million to additional homelessness services, secured \$135 million from the Commonwealth for more social housing and are working in partnership with the Commonwealth to secure funds from the \$10 billion Housing Australia Future Fund.

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
