Welcome to 2025! I hope you've had a great start to the year and wish you a wonderful year ahead.

This year we continue our work in helping ease the costof-living pressures and assisting with housing solutions. In this edition of my newsletter, I have highlighted some of the Malinauskas Government's initiatives introduced to support our most vulnerable when they need it most.

We've introduced measures to help first home buyers by removing stamp duty (with no property value cap). Eligible buyers can also receive a \$15,000 grant to assist with the purchase of a newly-built home. We are also working to provide 1,144 public homes by mid-2026 to help with housing accessibility.

My Electorate Office has relocated to Lightsview Village, Shop 5/163-169 Fosters Road, Lightsview. We are open Monday to Friday from 9am to 5pm.

SCAM ALERT FOR SA SENIORS

South Australian seniors are being urged to be aware of a scam website that attempts to charge applicants a fee in exchange for a Seniors Card. The website, **theseniorsassistant.com**, claims to specialise in "providing assistance and consultation services for several senior-related applications and processes such as the Seniors Card." Seniors should be aware that the SA Seniors Card is always free of charge and applicants are never requested to pay a fee or disclose their bank, credit card or PayPal details in exchange for membership.

COST OF LIVING

NEW COST OF LIVING MEASURES IN 2025

The State Government has introduced a range of new and expanded cost-of-living measures for 2025.

These initiatives include:

- ✓ Health Care Card holders can access concession travel on public transport
- ✓ Families will benefit from the renewed material and services subsidy (\$200 per public school student)
- ✓ Share houses now have access to household concessions
- ✓ Extended eligibility and access to the GlassesSA subsidy
- ✓ Increased access to and the level of support available under the Emergency Electricity Payment Scheme, assisting an additional 1300 households experiencing bill hardship
- ✓ Expanded access to the funeral assistance scheme by increasing the current asset threshold from \$3000 to \$4000
- ✓ Improved access to Changing Places facilities for around 10,000 Companion Card holders
- ✓ Improving the Home Dialysis Concession and
- ✓ Access to concessions for about 500 asylum seekers.

These measures complement ongoing cost-of-living initiatives by the Malinauskas Government, which include:

- ✓ Energy bill relief (\$300 per household)
- ✓ Doubled cost-of-living concessions for eligible South Australians and
- ✓ Free public transport for Seniors Card holders.

TRANSPORT

LABOR'S COMMITMENT TO BRINGING TRAINS AND TRAMS BACK INTO PUBLIC HANDS

The Malinauskas Labor Government is preparing to return our rail services to public ownership after they were privatised by the former Liberal Government. Essential services must be kept in public hands to ensure they serve the community effectively.

The Liberals have refused to rule out the possibility of selling off rail services again, if they return to government. This is a shocking admission that re-privatisation remains a viable option should the Liberals regain power.

Now is a great time to remind South Australians of how together, we fought to stop the privatisation of our trains and trams, and how we're fulfilling our election commitment to reverse the Liberals' sell-off.

In addition, the Malinauskas Labor Government has made it easier for people to use public transport by providing SA Seniors Card holders with free all-day travel on Adelaide Metro services.

Providing accessible public transport is essential for our community, which is why I made the commitment to deliver the Lightsview Go-Zone, further improving public transport services in our area.



PLANNING

ON-STREET PARKING ISSUES

Car parking has become a significant concern, especially in areas undergoing substantial infill development. My office has received many enquiries from residents about cars parked on-street that obstruct rubbish trucks and hinder vehicle movement in narrow streets.

The Malinauskas Labor Government is addressing these issues to alleviate congestion and enhance amenity in Adelaide's neighbourhoods.

To address this, we are consulting on proposed changes to planning laws that would establish updated minimum offstreet parking requirements for new residential developments in Greater Adelaide.

The draft bill proposes a Vehicle Parking Scheme, requiring one parking space for one-bedroom dwellings and at least two for homes with two or more bedrooms. Additionally, the minimum dimensions for off-street parking areas will be increased to accommodate larger vehicles, with single vehicle parks measuring 3.5 metres wide and 6 metres long, and a minimum garage door size of 3 metres.

Under the proposed changes, vehicle parks do not necessarily need to be covered garages or carports, but at least one must be capable of being covered in the future. The scheme will apply to residential developments throughout Greater Adelaide, with potential exclusions for certain areas. Community consultation with the building industry and local government will be undertaken.
